CHILDREN'S BOOK BANK AFTER DARK

One of the Club's most rewarding ongoing volunteer activities is to help the Children's Book Bank (CBB) clean and prepare books for children in the community. The CBB strives to improve literacy skills of low-income children by providing them with books of their own before they enter Kindergarten.

Children living in poverty often enter Kindergarten lacking the fundamental sills critical for learning to read. Statistics show that a child from a low-income family enters first grade with an average of only 25 hours of one-to-one picture book reading, compared with 1,000 to 1,700 hours from a child coming from a typical middle-class home!

To combat this epidemic and increase literacy, the CBB relies solely on the help of volunteers to clean, repair, and organize books to be distributed. Knowing that we are making a significant different in a child's early-education is rewarding. The nostalgia that comes from looking through children's books is icing on the cake!

The CBB is always accepting new and well-preserved used children's books.
